

Jon Stevens Makes a Noise for Operation LRH

One of Australia's most popular recording artists, Jon Stevens has thrown his support behind Latrobe Regional Hospital's Operation LRH.

The front man of 80's rock band Noiseworks will perform at Traralgon's Cargo Lounge on Friday 7 August to raise money for the hospital's current fundraising appeal.

Operation LRH aims to raise \$500,000 over two years towards the purchase of additional equipment for the hospital's operating theatres.

"Jon is thrilled to support this worthwhile cause and the work of Latrobe Regional Hospital," Artist Manager Simon Lucas said.

"It's all about keeping money in the local community and we can make that happen by giving people a memorable night out in Traralgon, while supporting a great cause – Operation LRH," he said.

"Any money we can raise on the night will go towards the purchase of additional equipment to improve the hospital's capacity to deliver more services," Mr Lucas said.

Stevens' fans will recall Noiseworks released several multi-platinum selling albums including the self-titled Noiseworks, Touch and Love Vs Money.

Noiseworks' first album went straight to number one and spent 63 weeks in the charts. The last greatest hits album took the bands total record sales to 1.2 million.

Stevens has performed to more than a million people in the role of Judas in Jesus Christ Superstar and toured the world as the seventh member and vocalist with INXS.

"Jon enthralled the audience every time, he delivers a hard edged and energetic performance," Artist Manager Simon Lucas said.

"Showcasing his voice, the Jon Stevens Trio will perform a stripped back version of his hit songs to an acoustic backdrop."

Tickets to the event are \$35 including a complimentary beer, wine or soft drink with all proceeds going towards Operation LRH.
